Who qualifies for the multi-trade pre-apprenticeship program?

- Must be eligible to work in Ontario
- Must be 16 years of age or older
- Must possess OSSD or equivalent
- Must demonstrate the ability to do or acquire the necessary reading, writing and trade-related math skills
- Must be willing to complete the program by attending every day
- Must demonstrate a commitment to working in the construction trades industry
- Must complete labour market research to find 1 or 2 companies that you would be interested in doing a work placement with
- Cannot be a registered apprentice or currently be attending a formal institution

Financial considerations

- No cost associated with the program
- Textbooks, toolkit and a work boots voucher will be provided
- If you are currently an Employment Insurance (EI) recipient, we strongly advise you to speak to Service Canada directly regarding your eligibility to continue receiving assistance while attending a pre-apprenticeship program. If you are asked to provide any additional program details, please don't hesitate to reach out and we will advise accordingly.
- Carefully review your financial requirements and supports available for the entire 11-week program before applying

After the multi-trade preapprenticeship program

- Possibility of starting an apprenticeship after work placement
- Referrals to Employment Ontario service providers for either job search, work placement and/or continued academic training
- Participants will be contacted at 3, 6 and 12-month intervals following program completion updates

How will Georgian College select participants?

- Review PowerPoint presentation and submit an application
- In order to apply to program, you MUST submit your current resume and transcript from highest level of education
- Be available for an informal virtual applicant interview
- As per Ministry of Labour, Immigration, Training and Skills Development (MLITSD) guidelines, be willing and able to provide - Proof of Age & Social Insurance Number.
- Respond to questions via email after applying
